Emotional Literacy Support Assistant Programme

The ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support programme aims to build the capacity of schools to support the emotional needs of pupils from within their own resources; recognising that children learn better and are happier in school if their emotional needs are also addressed. This is achieved by training teaching assistants (TAs) to become 'ELSAs', to develop and deliver individualised support programmes to meet the emotional needs of children and young people in their schools; Swindon Educational Psychology Service received funding from the Clinical Commissioning Group, Public Health and the Virtual School to train TAs from every school in Swindon over a 2 year period (2018/19-2019/20). During this period all schools were able to access free places for 2 TAs to train as ELSAs over a 6 day training course as well as to attend follow-up supervision sessions. As of March 2020; 57 out of 66 Primary Schools, 12 out of 14 Secondary Schools, 1 alternative provision and 1 Special School had been trained (totalling 138 ELSAs from 71 schools and settings).

The report (see the link below) provides a summary of how the programme was delivered in Swindon as well as an evaluation of how it was perceived by those who attended the courses. A further study to measure the impact of the ELSA programme on the emotional needs of children and young people involved in ELSA interventions is currently underway.
